There will be a meeeting of the Transfer Station and Recycling Committee beginning at 7pm
Tuesday May 26th at the Town Office agenda items include:

1. Review of the minutes from the May 11th meeting.

George Macdonald motioned to accept the minutes, Jack Sutton seconded, vote 7-0 in favor.

2. Update on regrading and paving around the new addition.

The regrading and paving has been completed. Extra work was done around the north side door of the baler room, to correct a water flow problem. Extra cost was \$3,500.

Installing the jersey barrier to block traffic from getting to close to the building was discussed.

Redirecting water runoff from the roof was discussed.

3. Draft of the description of demo vs. clean wood for public hearing June 2.

After reviewing Bill Nason's draft for the public hearing, Jack suggested some revisions to better define the different types of wood. After some discussion, Jack motioned to accept the revised draft, George seconded, vote 7-0 in favor.

4. Compost-developing an adequate plan for turning and handling.

It was decide to handle the compost by dividing into four piles, each pile down the line working toward the finished product.

A sign will be posted to alert customers to the finished product that is ready for use.

5. Recap of the haz-waste collection day.

The haz-waste day was the most successfull so far. With at least twenty five people registered, and only about three that did not show.

6. Other.

The estimate on replacing the siding on the south side of the building was discussed. Materials \$672 and less than \$1,000 for labor. Funds will be taken from the maintenance budget. George motioned to accept the project not to exceed a total cost of \$2,500, Jack seconded vote 7-0 in favor.

Possibly allowing people to take the old siding for firewood was discussed.

Bruce Galouch agreed to contact C.B.Davis for the sheet metal and duct work.

The possibilty of mandatory recycling in the future was discussed.

Baling polystyrene styrofoam was discussed.

Bruce updated the committee on the latest on the Hatch Hill recycling proposal.
